June – Accomplishment: Busyness, Priorities, & Strength

Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established. - <u>Proverbs 16:3</u>

There is an element of our culture that glorifies being busy. It schedules and books a person within an inch of their lives, and fills the in between with distraction and noise, never allowing a moment for rest, solitude, or meaningful reflection. Somehow it is based in the lie that the more we accomplish, the better, more fulfilled, or more successful we will be. However, many are increasingly aware of this lie and there is emerging a similarly popular opposite end of the spectrum. This one prioritizes relaxation, "self-care", and comfort to a paralyzing degree where nothing at all ever happens because we are all too busy working up the energy or the courage to move in the first place. Neither extreme is helpful to our calling.

The solution lies in Purpose.

Why do we do what we do?

Purpose allows us to (relatively) easily decide what to do and what not to do, when to do it and with whom. Did you know that it is not enough to "do the right thing"? We must also do it for the right reason! On the surface this might seem like even one more requirement to make what was already hard even more impossible, but if you contemplate this for a moment, it becomes increasingly obvious that it is precisely the opposite. Purpose is precisely the often overlooked secret to make doing the right thing even *possible*. The right thing is almost always difficult, either in deed or in choice. Our human weakness needs greater motivation than "it's the right thing to do" to maintain an upright course of action long term. We need to be fully committed, all in, head over heels unconditionally and permanently in love with our purpose in order to gain clear direction for our choices, and the motivation to carry them through.

So, what is our purpose?

Well, Our Lord makes this very clear. Our Purpose is Him.

But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides. – Matthew 6:33

Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. – Matthew 22:37-38

If anyone comes to Me and does not hate his own father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be My disciple. Luke 14:26

But I'm not strong enough?

in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. 9 But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong. – 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

But what if I don't want to?

What if something else is more appealing to my will? What if I'd rather pursue fame, fortune, food, and family? They are more comfortable and more instantly gratify, I grant you, but they do not last. These fleeting things leave us empty and with no taste for God. They only leave us wanting more.

<u>June Challenge:</u> In light of the above, let us spend this month in contemplating where our heart is. What do we pursue? Is our purpose truly what we say it is? And on the other side of that, what is something we can say yes to that will help us to grow closer to our goal of intimacy and union with God this month?

The following are some of the Word's most powerful passages on what it means to be Called to Action and Accomplishment with the proper intention and from the only true Source of strength. Come back to them as often as necessary. Some you may have heard, others more obscure. Give each passage its essential time to sink in and make a fresh mark on your heart. (Be sure to re-read the *"How to Use This Book"* and *Lectio Divina* guidelines in the Intro if you need a refresher on the most effective way to approach these verses.)
